Working with a Study permit

As a Student You can work only **PART-TIME**, and, in any case, for a maximum of **1040 hours** per year:

20hours/week for 12 months 40hours/week for 6 months

Contract validity: it cannot exceed the validy of your student permit





EMPLOYEE VS SELF-EMPLOYED



Employee

- Someone who works under an employment contract
- Employee is paid by an employer with a wage or a salary
- The work organization is defined by the employer
- Workers/ blue collars, Clerks,
 Professionals/experts, Managers

Self-employed

- Working for oneself as a freelance or the owner of a business
- Contract with a trade or business directly
- Organize the work independently
- Intellectual professionals: doctors, journalists, freelance workers, lawyers...
- Manual workers: plumbers, store-keeper, retailer



EMPLOYEE VS SELF-EMPLOYED



Employee

- The labor contract is regulated by the **National Agreement**
- **Social security** contribution are charged both to the employer and the employee
- **Income taxes and pension**: contribution payments are withheld by the employer every month
- If you have a job contract, you can register with the Italian Health System for free

Self-employed

- **P.IVA** (VAT) when the activity is run on a regular basis
- Self employed professionals have usually their finances handled by an **accountant**
- **Income taxes**: tax declaration must be made by the person
- **Pension and social security:** contribution payment is mandatory and are charged on the person



TEMPORARY JOBS / GIG JOBS

Working without P.IVA (VAT)

- When the activity is not run on a regular basis
- When an entrepreneurial organization is not needed

! The criteria is qualitative not quantitative (no limit to € 5,000.00)

Two ways:

Self employed jobs (lavoro autonomo occasionale) e.g.: Graphic designer; web developer; Freelancer

Work as an **employee** not on a regular basis (lavoro occasionale accessorio) e.g.: Baby-sitter; Delivery Rider; Cleaner/Housekeeper; Shop Assistant





TEMPORARY JOBS / GIG JOBS

Terms and Conditions in Written form

- content of the job
- compensation
- Recession

The client

- Private person
- Legal entity

The invoice

- Valid as Receipt of payment
- Must include the withholding tax (R.A.) of 20% in case of Legal Entity
- Revenue stamp of € 2,00 for invoices > € 77,47



TEMPORARY JOBS / GIG JOBS

Fiscal Treatment

Applies to the Income:

Revenue –
Direct cost (billing) =
Taxable income

No Tax is due up to € 4,800.00

Social Security

- •Mandatory for income > € 5,000.00
- •1/3 charged to the worker
- •2/3 charged to the Client
- •Apply to Gestione Separata INPS
- •Mandatory info to the Client





Occasional job for private/families

- Baby-sitter, House keeping, Gardening, private lessons, ...
- Voucher (Libretto di Famiglia)
- Within the limit of:

€ 5,000.00 per year € 2,500.00 each client ! Up to € 6,666.00 for student < 25 years old

- Voucher can be bought online on INPS website by the «utilizzatore»
- The student must sign up on INPS website (prestatore) with his SPID (Digital identity)





VAT number

VAT number is mandatory when self employed activity is run on a regular basis

To get a VAT Number You MUST convert your permit from Study to Work (lavoro autonomo)

HOW: Apply online on Agenzia delle Entrate website (AA9/12 Form)

WHEN: within 30 days since the beginning of the activity

Which One: If You are a Start Up You can choose the «Regime Forfettario» -

(Turnover must not exceed € 65,000.00)

Advantages: Flat Tax at 15% (5% for the first 5 years!)



Internship

Internship is one of the most common ways to enter in an organization

Learning through a working activity: it is not a WORK contract

Maximum period: 6 months

Compensation: min € 400 full time / € 300 part time

Insurance (through University/Agency)

Content/Objective





Temporary employment (Lavoro Interinale)



Your **Direct Employer** is the Temporary Agency

Flexibility: workload, substitution, ...

Fixed term

Terms and Conditions must be equivalent to the other Employees



THE EMPLOYMENT: TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Employment letter

- Job position
- Location
- Starting date
- Salary
- National Agreement Grade
- Working hours
- Probation period

National Agreement

- Grades
- Minimum wages
- Employer's and Employee's duties and obligations
- Disciplinary actions (notice)



The salary issue

Minimum level is set by the National Agreement

Small Companies can offer a higher salary (but less training opportunities)

The «entry level» salary for young graduate: some companies have specific policies for «talent»

See the «bigger picture»:

- total reward compensation
- look at the salary in 3 years perspective

HOW TO CHOOSE YOUR FIRST JOB: QUICK TIPS

1

Don't wait too long for the **ideal job:** it is easier to find a better job when you are working

2

Don't expect to find a job immediately after your course of studies: it can take months and don't demoralize yourself

3

Use this time in a smart way: don't remain «passive»(e.g. acquire additional skills)

4

Look for a job that can offer **training opportunities**: focus on competency improvement in the first years



Look for a «good Boss»



THE FIRST 3 – 5 YEARS

The first 3 to 5 years of job are crucial: focus on the long-term perspective

Focus on acquire competencies:

- Technical competencies (improvement)
- Behavioral competencies

Use this time to understand how an organization works:

- How deal with your boss
- How deal with your colleagues

Use this time to set your professional objectives and to discover your «talents» (your strengths and your weaknesses) Use this time to understand what kind of career fits with your personality
